

## Supplier Quality Notification

### UID Label Marking (CDR028)

Dear BAE Systems Supplier:

There has been recent confusion regarding BAE's SQAM (Supplier Quality Assurance Manual) part marking requirements of section 7.2 and the requirements of the CDR Manual (Contract Deliverable Requirements); CDR 028 (Unique Identification) and subsequent drawing note UID requirements. The purpose of this Quality Notification is to provide further direction.

Where CDR 028 Unique Identification is deployed, the supplier is to follow the requirements found in the BAE systems CDR Manual and the specific directions of the drawing note requiring the UID. Specifically, for Machine Readable Identification (MRID), the part number **MUST** match the part number called out in the UID note of the drawing **without** suffixes like the (\*XX) number found on the purchase order. Adding a suffix to the MRID will cause an error when entering the part number in to the government database.

Additionally, SQAM 7.2 Part Identification Marking requirements must also be met when CDR028 is required. Per section 7.2 of the SQAM, these markings must include the Part Number as defined on the purchase order line item for the part (this includes the suffixes, if present). This shall be met with additional part marking, following SQAM section 7.2 direction.
